


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O1 What is C.A.R.E.S.?

C.A.R.E.S. during the school day







Cooperation

I can work with others.

Assertion

I can speak up for myself and others.



Responsibility

I can make strong choices.



Empathy

I can understand others' feelings.



Self-control

I can pause and think about my choices before I speak and act.

Community Service

- What communities might we impact?
 - Classroom
 - School
 - Local community



Impacting the Classroom w/ C.A.R.E.S.

• Examples:

- Showing Self-control by letting someone else go first today
- Showing Empathy by being patient during the Number Sense routine, recognizing that everyone needs different time to think and learn
- Showing **Responsibility** by focusing on recycling any paper we might throw in the trash this week
- Showing Assertion by looking for someone who needs someone to play with at recess
- Showing Cooperation by identifying a problem in the classroom and working together to come up with a solution during morning meeting

Impacting the School w/ C.A.R.E.S.

• Examples:

- Showing Cooperation by working as a whole school to improve our efforts to recycle
- Showing Cooperation to improve our school grounds by cleaning trash, pulling weeds, planting new plants
- Showing **Responsibility** by helping Mr. Keenan clean the lunch room
- Showing Assertion by standing up for others when they aren't being treated kindly or fairly

Impacting the Local Community w/ C.A.R.E.S.

• Examples:

- Showing Cooperation by working together to collect donations for a local organization
- Show Empathy by making bagged meals for the homeless through PathForward
- Show Assertion by seeing a problem in the community and developing a service project to make change

Community Service: Day of Service

- Kick-off pep rally the 2nd Friday of the school year
- A choice board of service projects will be provided and all classes will select one project to complete on the "Day of Service"

Community Service: Classroom Projects

- Grade Level Classrooms
 - Each homeroom class will identify 1 project they will work on over the course of the year
 - Might impact school as a whole or local community
 - Classes might work as a whole or students in a class might work individually on separate projects (determined by grade levels)
 - Classes will commit to their project by the end of October
 - Classes will complete their project by June
- Specials(Art, PE, Music, Library) Teams
 - Each specials subject will identify a project they will support all grade levels to collaborate on during the year
 - Their project may impact the school or local community

Members

Students

5th grade students who apply and commit to promoting C.A.R.E.S. meet monthly to plan initiatives for supporting the school in exhibiting C.A.R.E.S. They also determine & plan school wide service projects.

Staff

Meet as a staff team monthly to plan and support the work that student members decide upon as their focus or action steps.



Promote C.A.R.E.S.

Collaboratively decide on ways to engage all school members in knowing, understanding, and exhibiting the components of C.A.R.E.S (caring, assertion, responsibility, empathy, and self-control

School-wide Service Projects

Goals

Generating ideas for service projects, planning for, advertising, and engaging the whole school in participation in service projects Ex: Food Drive, New Years Cards for retired service members

Building Community

Working to engage students and staff in thinking about, talking about, and actions toward demonstrating C.A.R.E.S. Ex: C.A.R.E.S. Reads during morning meeting

Plan

Plan school wide service projects or initiatives

Advertise

Advertise for any school wide service projects so students and parents will know how to contribute

Demonstrate

Members will demonstrate and serve as examples of C.A.R.E.S. for other students

Identify Needs

Members will identify needs that exist in our school to help C.A.R.E.S. be shown by all.

Gather Input

Members will gather input from students and staff about how much C.A.R.E.S is demonstrated and how we can improve as a school.
