As a teacher who is Jewish and believes that we need to educate in order to stop hateful rhetoric, I often end up pausing lessons to discuss the effects and ramifications that these "jokes" have, but I am only one person. I think if we were to focus our exemplary project on becoming upstanding citizens and community members then we might see this decrease. Students currently see memes, and celebrities who promote hateful rhetoric (i.e. Kanye West) and they think these things are just "memes" and not how it affects real people, cultures, and society. We are a "no place for hate" school, but it is usually just 1 activity a year... the kids aren't being ingrained with this. We are living in a time where the media is so fast moving and kids are taking in one thing and going to the next so quickly without really understanding it. I think it would be important that students get educated on current events, on historical significances, and work against hatred.
