Grounding Activity

10 Things in Common

Come up with a list of 10 things that everyone at your table has in common.

Off limits: Anything related to Innovation or education

Be prepared to share a few things from your list with the larger group



Innovation Caucuses

Private meetings that promote decision making



Innovation Caucuses



A caucus is a structured meeting of stakeholders designed to come to consensus on a topic.

Allows limited time for persuasion and discussion.

Focuses on the choice of the group while giving voice

to the individuals.

Highlights shifts in preferences.





Caucus Process



1. Select The Framework

- a. Select your preferred framework and gather to discuss why this framework best addresses the project's goals.
 - i. Undecided can meet in a separate space to list what their priorities are.

2. Advocate

 Each group has 3 minutes to advocate for their framework, or list their priorities (if undecided).

3. Realign

- a. Participants will move to the framework that they feel best fits the goals.
- b. Participants can also move their level of consensus up or down the chart.

4. Reflection

 After each round, the group can reflect on the process and determine if a decision has been made.

5. Repeat

a. Start at step 2 for subsequent rounds



Innovation Caucus



Step	Purpose	Time
Align	Choose and identify reasons why this framework matches our goals.	5 Minutes
Advocate	Articulate the reasons and listen to the benefits of the frameworks.	2 Minutes/Framework
Realign	Reconsider preferences and show the changes in thinking.	2 Minutes
Reflect	Determine if consensus has been reached around a framework	3 Minutes
Repeat	Continue the process until consensus has been reached.	15-20 Minutes



Sample Chart Paper

Framework	Levels of Consensus
List the framework here with a quick description of the important parts of the framework.	I like it, am on board, and can easily accept this decision.
*Add details as we go through additional rounds.	I accept this decision, but may have some questions/points to clarify later.
Reasons for Support	I can live with this decision, even though it may not be my preferred option.
Participants can list some of the reasons that they support this framework.	I don't agree, but will not block this decision.
*Sticky notes provided	I loathe it, and cannot accept this decision.
