Action Priority Matrix


Action Priority Matrix Quadrants

1. High-impact, low effort: Quick wins that can build support and momentum towards our goals.

2. High impact, high effort: Long term initiatives that require careful planning and consideration. Resources, capacity, and flexibility need to be considered.

3. Low impact, low effort: Considerations that need to be accounted, but will not lead to big movement toward our goals.


4. Low impact, high effort: Time consuming tasks that do not support our goals. These are items that may need to be sunset or redesigned to better meet our needs.
